Membership Renewal Time

Membership in the Tallahassee Watercolor Society provides an artist contact with 180 other artists who have similar interests. Through the newsletter which is published 9 times during the year, artists are informed about issues, events, dialogues, exhibits and classes. Participation is encouraged. A member may also apply to both major art exhibits that TaWS plans and sponsors. Tri-State is in the spring. Brush Strokes is in the fall.

Membership must be paid by now with a March 1st deadline in order to apply for either the Tri-State or Brush Strokes exhibitions.

Partnerships

Did you ever wonder what makes a society strong? First of all there must be a commitment to support its members. Then it develops relationships to the community where it exists. When the community sees a value in that society, the society becomes stronger with the community's support.

One goal of the Tallahassee Watercolor Society is to reach out and form partnerships with other organizations in the Tallahassee area which benefit both groups. Some organizations that we are very proud to work with are C.O.C.A., the Gadsden Art Center in Quincy, FL, the TMH Cancer Center through the TMH Foundation and the Tallahassee Senior Center. We teach. We exhibit. We participate in their programs. We learn from them.

The latest partnership to develop is with the TMH Diabetes Center on Capital Circle NE in Tallahassee. We were approached by the TMH Foundation to form this partnership in which they will provide exhibit space and exposure to the community for TaWS artists in an environment where there is a lot of people traffic. Paintings that will be hung there will contribute to a healing atmosphere for the patients.

A partnership only works if members agree to participate. Happily, this was discussed in the October general meeting. Three people volunteered to co-chair this project. At least a dozen more agreed to share their paintings. If you live in the Tallahassee area, expect to be contacted. Our co-chairpersons will be asking you to participate in the project by sharing and exhibiting your paintings.

Two other future partnerships are under consideration by the Board. One is with the Tallahassee Garden Club. The other is with the Florida Watercolor Society. Know that the Board will consider these partnerships very carefully before agreeing to work with other organizations. There must be one or two people to champion the project as chairpersons, and there must be members who will work with them.


TaWS Christmas Party

What a wonderful opportunity to be in the Colorado Mountains surrounded by the beauty of fall foliage. Nine artists came together to work in plein air as well as studio settings for the week of September 25 to October 1, 2011. Joye said we would be trying to find our creative voice, problem solving, dealing with accidents and learning new techniques of watercolor application. We stayed at Mt Princeton Hot Springs Resort, Nathrop, CO. The indoor studio/conference room overlooked a panoramic view of Chalk Valley. On the last day we were invited to the Ghost Town Guest House at St. Elmo, CO for a day of plein air painting.

One of Joye's demos was called "Ten Minute Painting". This is a technique that requires the artist to conceptualize the entire painting from drawing to finished painting in ten minutes. The finished painting is quite impressionistic but is a great way to learn to speed up the painting process. As a plein air painter, I have found it hard to complete paintings in the allotted time. Practicing quick painting frees the painter and renders a sense of excitement. "Paint with Passion!!!" –Joye Moon.


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
