M. Douglas Walton Workshop November 13, 14 & 15, 2012



The Tallahassee Watercolor Society presents the M. Douglas Walton Workshop. This is the first of two major water media workshops that we are bringing to Tallahassee this season. This will be three days of intense painting designed to expand our creativity.

The venue is a new location for us to rent. The Southside Arts Complex is located in a plaza on South Monroe where a Winn Dixie store once was. We have rented a spacious, well-lighted room. There is plenty of

parking available. The room has access to a kitchen and bathrooms.

M. Douglas Walton serves as adjunct professor and visiting lecturer for the School of Art and Architecture and as director of the Watercolor Encounter Program for the Division of Continuing Education at Louisiana Tech University. Several of our members have taken his workshops previously. Rosemary Ferguson, Betty Sittig and Deborah Morningstar have had a lot of fun with great results. Deborah recently attended his workshop in Pensacola, FL where he introduced latex paint as a water media.

This workshop will focus on using latex paint as a water media while pushing our creativity to the limits. The workshop is limited to 20 participants. Fourteen members have already reserved their seat. Because of a grant from COCA, we are able to keep the cost of the 3-day workshop at \$175.00. An additional cost of \$30.00 is added for non-members to become TaWS members. A \$75.00 deposit is required to reserve a seat. Latex paint will be provided. 



Please Help Keep COCA's Services Free!

I know you are familiar with at least a little bit of what COCA - the Council on Culture & Arts - does for our community and our region. I'd like to ask you to consider becoming a member of COCA this year, to help keep the wide array of services we provide to the community almost entirely free.



COCA exists to serve the arts community - creators, presenters, and patrons alike - and memberships are a big part of what allows us to do that.

Every year we provide services to arts groups, arts-related businesses, and individual artists, musicians, writers, actors, theatre technicians, dancers, and other creative people and enterprises. We give cultural grants to non-profits, support arts education, manage all COCA's online resources, including the www.MoreThanYouThought.com calendar and the online Artist Directory, and much, much more.

Memberships enabled us to accomplish so much this year:

After launching the "More Than You Thought This Week" e-mail last year, we have worked hard to extend the reach of that e-mail. Now your events are being sent directly to the in-boxes of more than 5,000 subscribers every Monday, and the list is still growing.

We created and launched two brand-new sections of our website: COCA for Kids a comprehensive guide to afterschool and weekend arts activities, classes, lessons, camps, birthday parties, and other activities appropriate for children and teens; and COCA's Outdoor Public Art Directory and Map, featuring more than 160 sculptures, murals, windows, memorials and monuments in the Tallahassee area.

We interviewed and profiled 52 artists for the Tallahassee Democrat's Sunday TLH section, helping to bring word of our area's incredible talent to more than 60,000 households every week.

We showed the work of 288 local artists in our galleries this year alone, including 82 young artists in the Winter Festival Youth Art Exhibition.

We held nine workshops - "Alert the Media" and "Creating a Killer Crowdfunding Campaign" - and four "Marketing Mondays" to help our artists and arts organizations learn about and take advantage of the marketing and fundraising opportunities in new media, plus three grant-writing workshops.

We also held a "Meet the Candidates" forum where members of the cultural community were able to share their issues with more than 20 candidates for City, County, and State offices.

We launched the first ever Americana Music Fest Contest, which resulted in sending the Sarah Mac Band to represent Tallahassee in Nashville at the Americana Music Conference and Festival. During the month-long contest, there were more than 22,000 votes cast in the contest from the general public for our 13 bands.

You may not be aware that COCA has not in the past done any fundraising in competition with the artists and cultural organizations that we serve. Therefore memberships are a particularly important way for us to help support our programs and services. Funding cuts at the city and state level have presented significant challenges to local arts organizations, including COCA, in the last two years.

We need your help more than ever to continue advocating for and serving the cultural community.
